Alice will be teaching the basics of the popular medium of Polymer Clay, different brands of clays, tools, skinner blends, millefiori canes and more.



Polymer clay is a colored modeling material that is baked in a home oven giving the user instant gratification. It is widely available in arts and craft stores and online.

Polymer Clay is still in it's infancy and typically thought of as a crafty material for children. However, many talented artists are now paving the way for this medium to share a place with other artistic materials. The New Clay by Nan Roche appeared on bookshelves in 1992 and dazzled readers with the incredible artwork shown within. A national guild was formed (NPCG) and a world wide phenomena began. Since then many books have been written, web-site developed and new artists have emerged.



The medium holds a tremendous amount of possibilities and attracts crafters and artists alike. Sculpture, jewelry, miniatures, millefiori beads, functional and decorative objects, faux surface design imitating precious stones, metals, wood are but a few application that can be achieved with polymer clay.
